Individualized instruction: Cater to the needs and learning styles of individual learners, providing differentiated activities and feedback.

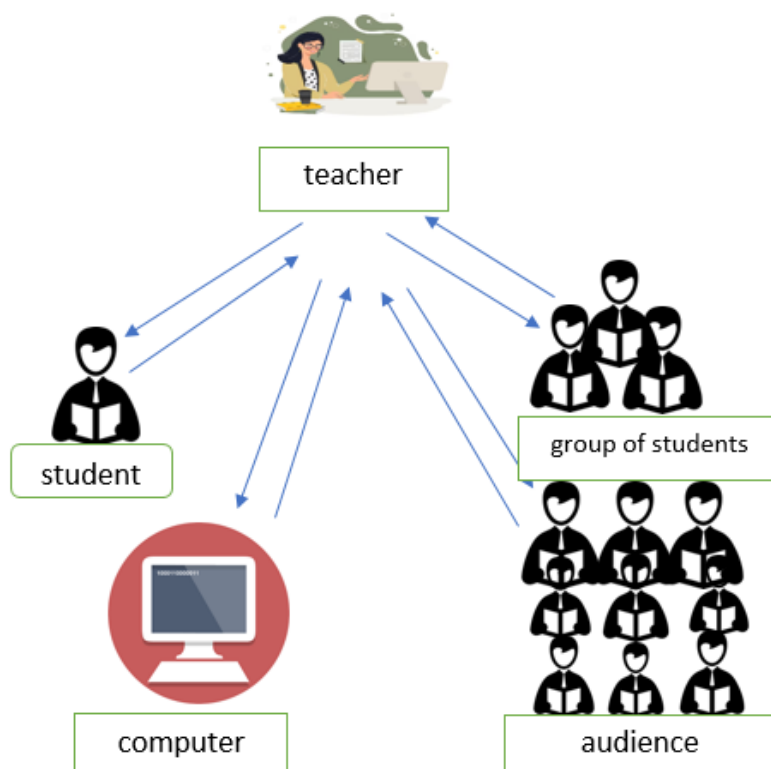
2. Task-Based Language Teaching (TBLT):
